How to Organize Academic CV for Scholarship? All CVs must have three parts: contact information, education and professional experience. However, I recommend that you add other sections that make it easier for the reader to identify relevant characteristics such as: Certificates and acknowledgments, Volunteering and other experiences, Software Skills and Languages. Contact: At the top of the page or in the header you must show your full name and your contact information such as address, phone and email. Avoid placing words such as "CV", "Curriculum Vitae" or "Resume" which do not make it look p... A curriculum vitae, commonly known as a CV, is a comprehensive record of your academic background as well as your research and teaching experience. Within academia, the CV is considered the standard proof of your credentials and should be used when applying for serious academic positions such as four-year colleges and universities. Perhaps the most critical part in any academic application process is writing an academic curriculum vitae that highlights your achievements and shows that youTMd be an asset to any educational institution youTMre looking to join. The good news? YouTMre about to write Academic CVs differ from the CVs typically used by non-academics in industry because you need to present your research, various publications and awarded funding in addition to the other items contained in a non-academic CV.
